**Local Planning Appeal Tribunal** 

**Building Better Communities and Conserving Watersheds Act, 2017** 

The Building Better Communities and Conserving Watersheds Act would, if passed, make changes to the Planning Act with the intention of giving communities a stronger voice in land use planning. The new Act would create the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal to replace the Ontario Municipal Board. The proposed changes would also create the Local Planning Appeal Support Centre.

The proposed legislation would also modernize the *Conservation Authorities Act* to guide the conservation of Ontario's watersheds. The legislation is intended to strengthen oversight and accountability, provide clarity for conservation authority roles and responsibilities, encourage public engagement and modernize funding mechanisms. These proposed changes are meant to enable conservation authorities to support future provincial priorities and give them the flexibility to address growing environmental pressures.

## **BILL 122 RECEIVES SECOND READING**



Bill 122 - the <u>Registered Professional Planners Act</u>, 2017, received Second Reading on May 11th and was passed unanimously. It has since been referred to the <u>Standing Committee on Regulations and Private Bills</u>. The Institute looks forward to the Bill being passed this summer or in the fall.

This legislation, if passed, will raise further awareness about the importance of planning and the role of the planning profession in creating and fostering healthy communities - putting the public

interest first.

To ensure adequate notice, any motion to be made at the AGM must be provided in writing and signed by three (3) members of OPPI eligible to vote on or before 5:00 p.m. on July 13th.
