## UPDATE ON COUNCIL DISCUSSION ON THE TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION CALLS TO ACTION

Earlier this year, OPPI asked members to provide us with your feedback regarding the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and how



OPPI can support members in their roles as planners. The feedback OPPI received was overwhelmingly supportive of this initiative and with members seeing value in OPPI investigating this area further.

At the March OPPI Council meeting, we invited Dr. Duke Redbird, Dr. Sheri Longboat and Calvin Brook, RPP, to share their insights and perspectives on how best to include Indigenous perspectives in planning, and how

OPPI can support members as they engage Indigenous peoples to incorporate their perspectives into the planning process.

As a result of this discussion, OPPI Council determined further work on this topic is required, including the creation of a Task Force to examine and recommend how OPPI can respond to these Calls to Action and support members.
